Profile of David Jubb WA7KAI

David William Jubb, WA7KAI, was born April 10, 1927 – a Depression Baby. He loved riding on his motorcycle up until the late 1990's, hence the nickname "Daring Dave". He went to Mt. Pleasant Grade School (where Dot's oldest great-grandchild, Shawn, will soon be going) and to Oregon City High School. The family home was beside a cemetery, safe place to play after hours. His first job was working at the Portland Shipyard (Commercial Iron Works). Then he went on to the Crown Zellerback Paper Mill. He joined the Navy in Portland and went to boot camp at the U.S. Naval Training Center in San Diego, CA. After being discharged, he went back to work for Crown Zellerback in West Linn where he worked for 41 years, retiring in

1984. In 1950, he took a correspondence course in radio and television servicing. He developed an interest in ham radio when his younger brother, Paul, who was at that time living in Phoenix, AZ, encouraged him to study for his license. He earned his Technician's license in 1969 and joined Air Force Mars which permitted him to communicate with Paul through the Mars Station in Sacramento, CA. He sat for his General class license in 1974 and earned his Extra Class license in 1990. He and two other hams from Milwaukie are volunteers for Emergency Communications at Provi-

dence Milwaukie Hospital. He married Dorothy Hammil Barnes (born 1932 in New York City) on September 13, 1997. She had been a widow for over six years. They met in church. Presently, they are members of Living Savior Lutheran Church in Tualatin, OR where they are volunteer money counters and where Dorothy is a Stephen Minister. They are both active in the Seniors' Group, Amazing Grays. Recently, Dave and another "ham", Monte AB7WS, spoke to the Boy Scout troop, who meet at the church, to try to get them interested in ham radio.
